 The presence of higher-than-normal body temperature in dogs can indicate an infection or illness.

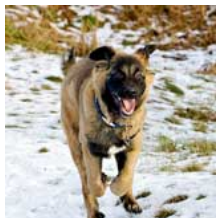


**FROSTBITE**

 A little bit of daily exercise is essential to a healthy lifestyle – for both your pet and you.

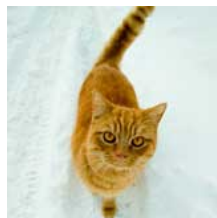


**NORWEGIAN FOREST CAT**
